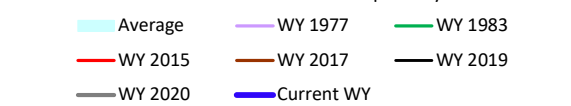
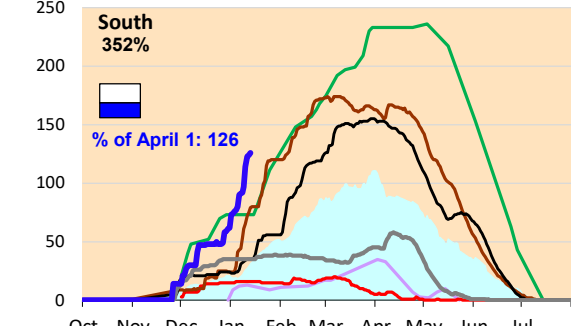
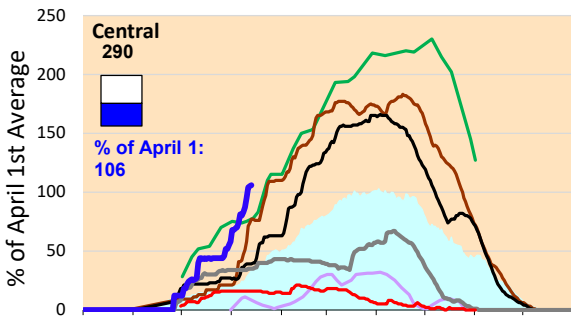
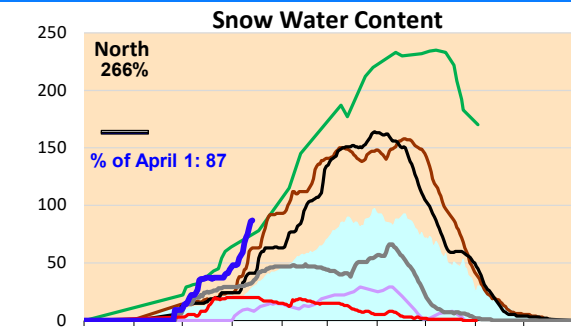
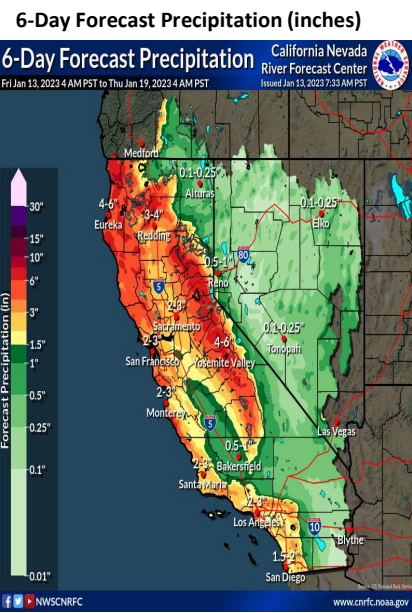


Strong storms are forecasted to continue for California though next week. Cumulative precipitation for the Sierras and runoff are higher than the historical average rates for this time of year. The snow water content is significantly above average and above levels in historically wet years.

*Note: Percentages in each plot refers to percent of average for this date. When historic data is unavailable, Snow Water Content Bar plot is not shown. The percent of historic average for each SWC location differs slightly from CDEC's report due to small discrepancies in historical data.



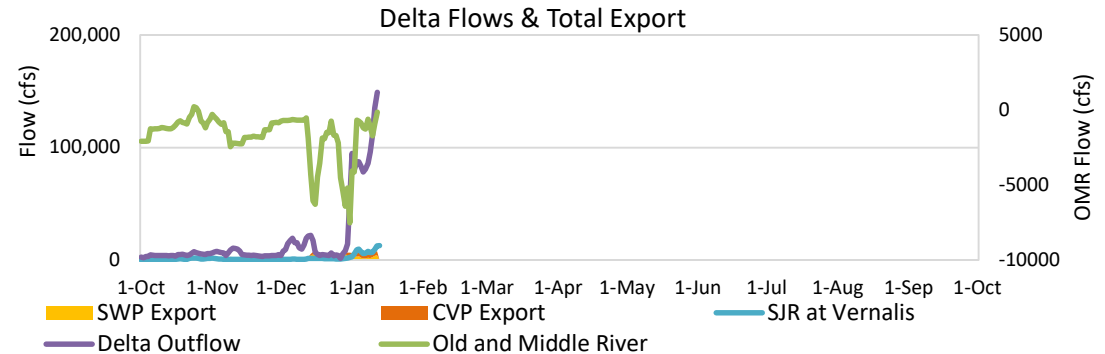


Project Operations

Delta outflow conditions are continuing at high levels with very low salinity. Delta outflows, and SAC and SJR inflows have increased as compared to last week. CVP and SWP export are higher than last week's amounts, as limited by fisheries restrictions. Shasta and Oroville Reservoir storage amounts have increased significantly, but remain below average levels for this time of years. Folsom Reservoir moved into flood control operations last week and will remain at flood control storage levels for the foreseeable future. All storage volumes increased from last week.
