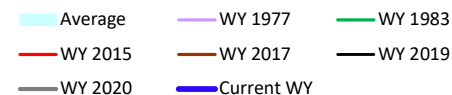
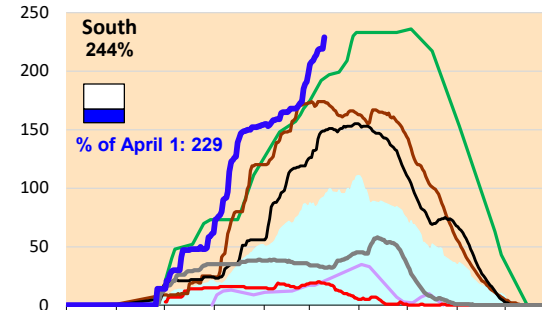
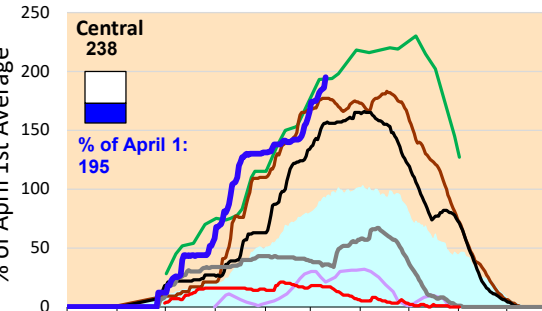
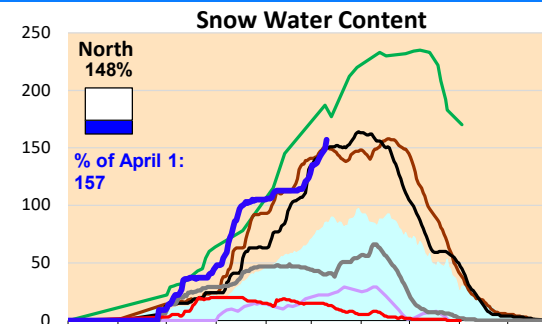
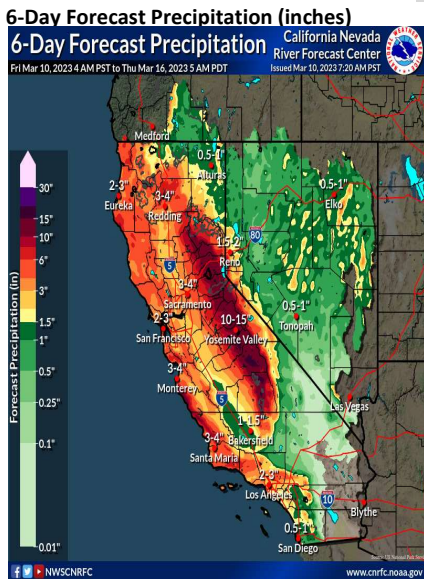
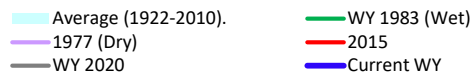
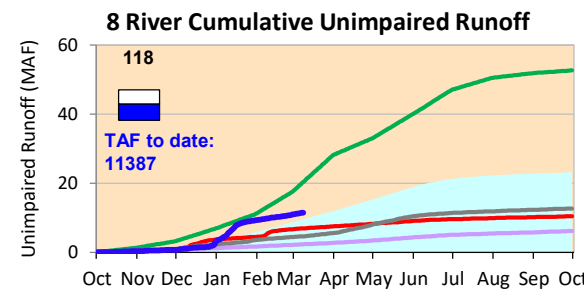
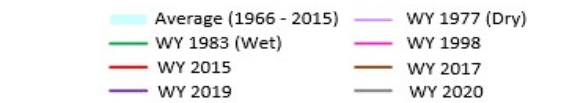


An atmospheric river is anticipated to bring heavy rainfall across the state through next week. Cumulative precipitation for the Sierras are above average value for this time of year. The snow water content is above the average values for this time of year. For the Central and South areas, snow water content is above the historical wet year (1983) for this time of year. Actual runoff is higher than the historical average rates.

# Project Operations

Delta outflow conditions continue to remain 'excess Delta conditions with restrictions'. Delta outflows and SJR inflows have increased as compared to last week, while Sacramento River inflows declined. Salinity conditions in the South Delta remained good last week, resulting in continuing high exports. Shasta reservoir storage amounts is below average levels for this time of year. The storage at Folsom and Oroville are at the historic average level. All storage volumes increased from last week.
